PRINCIPAL'S REFLECTION

English psychologist Edward de Bono is quoted as saying, 'Logic will never change emotion or perception.' Last weekend's Gospel reading focused on duty, preparation and consequences - words that resonate today as poignantly as they did 2000 years ago. The parable of the wise and foolish bridesmaids highlights the merits of planning for the future and pacing oneself to see that one has a future to enjoy. In Christian theology this is called 'discernment'. St Ignatius Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits, wrote a lot about discernment and one of his teachings is that the Holy Spirit allows us to prepare for our future without living it.

All of us, at various times of our lives, are participants of a difficult interview or a conversation we would rather not have. If we have the opportunity, we play out in our mind how the interaction will run; the encounter rarely happens how we imagine and we either find that our anxiety and fear has often been misplaced. or our lack of preparation has eventuated in an escalation of conflict. What is curious and reflects our frail 'human condition' is that on the next occasion we often go through this same process of trying to live the future all over again. Unfortunately, at times we are so anxious about an aspect of our future that we try and control it and everyone associated with it often resulting in an inability to contend with another's perspectives, leading to a stalemate at best.

St Ignatius was suspicious of this process. Ignatius seems to have understood last weekend's Gospel very well. The early church thought Jesus would return quickly - there was a crisis of faith when he didn't. Some Christians lived as though this imminent return was a fact - we are still waiting. Matthew tells us then, that the Christian life is about wisdom, right judgment and reading the signs of the times. St Ignatius tells us the best way to prepare for the future is to let go of the unhealed past, as best as we can, and live in the here and now. The Christian believes that the Holy Spirit helps us see what needs to be done today and what preparation is necessary for tomorrow. When

considering our interactions with others that are potentially challenging, there is much that is intrinsically sensible in appreciating de Bono's sentiments that relate to appreciating the emotion and perception of the other, and oneself, in addition to discussing what one considers 'the facts' because emotion and perception has a way of either magnifying or diminishing such facts. Thank you to all in our school community who appreciate the need to enter into hard conversations with an appreciation of the emotion and perception of all parties involved.

COVID School Health & Safety Plan - Thank you for your continued support and vigilance.

Thank-you to all our parents who continue to support our school's COVID-19 Safety Plan by observing signage regarding health and hygiene protocols. The following activities are now permitted:

Changes to bus services, commencing January 2021 (Merseylink)

On 17 January 2021 the Department of State Growth will be implementing changes to urban bus routes and timetables operated by Merseylink within the Devonport and Latrobe urban areas. This will be followed by changes to school bus routes commencing in Term 1, 2021.

The changes will impact the general access (i.e. public bus) network, as well as some student-only school bus services that operate within Devonport and the greater Devonport area.

Consultation on the general access network changes occurred in September-October 2019. A <u>final public consultation report</u> was published in February 2020, which outlined State Growth's responses to submissions, including changes to the draft timetables and routes based on community feedback. Consultation on the school bus network also occurred in September 2020.

As the implementation of the general access network was delayed due to COVID-19, State Growth has made some additional tweaks and improvements to the general access network.

For St Patrick's Catholic School, the following additional changes (beyond those mentioned in the public consultation report) will be implemented:

Students living in the Palmers Road/Frankford Road area will now be able to catch a Merseylink school bus to and from school.

We will publish final timetables and route maps for the new general access and school bus networks on our website in late November. We will be in contact with you again at this time to provide you with more information.

- We are requesting parents refrain from purchasing outside the set stationery list in the interests of avoiding unneeded distractions in class, please do not purchase items such as sequinned pencil, cases or outlandish stationery items that will distract children and usually causes unneeded anxiety if the item gets lost or broken.

Due to the restricted area available for the audience (we can support up to 12 adults) in the interests of fairness, we are restricting this event to students and staff only.

COVID-19 Update (Mr Linhart)

As you are no doubt aware the Tasmanian Government has recently relaxed Tasmania's border controls and travel restrictions. Whilst this is welcome news the Tasmanian Government has acknowledged the corresponding risk of COVID-19 infection reoccurring in Tasmania. Therefore, accordingly, the Tasmanian Government requires St Patrick's Catholic School to maintain a high state of COVID-19 risk management readiness.

Thus, I am pleased to advise you that all normal day to day school activities and associated interactions are permitted with the exception of:

- •In-door gatherings involving large numbers of parents / visitors in excess of 250 persons.
- •School indoor end of year functions with more than 250 persons in attendance.

However, mindful of the Tasmanian Government's requirements, St Patrick's will continue to maintain a range of COVID-19 risk management practices including:

- •Discouraging visitors, staff and students with cold or flu symptoms from coming to School.
- Adults, where practicable, to maintain physical distancing.
- *The recording of contact details of visitors to school events held in school venues.
- •The provision of hand sanitiser.
- Appropriate COVID safety signage at school entry points.
- •Cleaning of frequently touched internal surfaces.

As we progress towards a new normal, St Patrick's Catholic School, as guided by Catholic Education Tasmania will continue to take into account the level of risk of COVID-19 which exists in the community together with changes in government restrictions and will calibrate our management of the COVID-19 risk accordingly.

Updates will continue to be shared with the school community as they become available. Thank you for your ongoing co-operation and understanding of our efforts to keep our community safe.

COMMUNITY NEWS & REMINDERS

Years 2-5 Swimming Program

Our 10-day school swimming program commenced on Monday 9th November and will run through to Friday 20th November. We support the Latrobe Swim Centre's request that we communicate to parents that they are currently running with the current ruling by Health and Safety Standards, in regard to "no parent/ spectator present" during swim programs whilst the facility is booked. Class times are:

Year 5: 9.00am - 9.45am. Year 4: 9.45am - 10.30am. Year 3: 10.30am - 11.15am. Year 2: 11.15am - 12.00pm.

Some important considerations include:

- Band-aids are not to be worn in the pool Earrings may be worn.
- Students may wear their PE uniform to and from school for the duration of the swimming program.
- A bathing cap is essential students will not be permitted to swim without a cap. We have a small amount of swimming caps available at the school office for sale. (\$3.50)
- Students will walk to and from the venue under the supervision of school staff.
- Children should bring a plastic bag in which to put their wet bathers, bathing cap and wet towel.
- Goggles (may be worn when permitted by the instructor).
- Students may wear bathers to school, however, students will require clean underclothes to change into

 for the swimming program;
- Sunscreen will be available, however, students will need to apply the sunscreen themselves.

2020 Pre-Kinder: 2021 Kinder

St Patrick's School will be offering a Pre-Kinder program each Monday morning for five weeks for children who have been accepted into our 2020 Kindergarten class. The sessions will begin at 9.00am and conclude at 10.30am, and all sessions will take place in the St Patrick's School Kindergarten classroom on the following days (children to bring a drink & morning tea): Monday 16th November; Monday 23rd November; Monday 30th November; Monday 7th December (FINAL PRE-KINDER.)
