Book Pack

Please place the following items in your child's pencil case: scissors, 1 glue stick, 1 rubber, coloured pencils, texts, 2 grey lead writing pencils. Please also return remaining stationery items to school in a clearly labelled snap lock bag for access when required.

Diary

It is important that the school diary is brought to school and taken home and signed everyday, as it allows for daily correspondence between teacher and parents. They are an essential form of communication between home and school. It should be used to communicate absences, illnesses or if your child is unable to complete a homework task. As communicated in the school policy, please ensure that you check and sign your child's diary each day.

Hats

Hats are compulsory in Terms 1 and 4 of the school year. Please ensure that your child has a hat to wear at school every day during these times.

Smocks

Every child needs a smock at school at all times. An old t-shirt or shirt is sufficient, however, waterproof ones are ideal. These are best left in school bags please.

Library Bags
